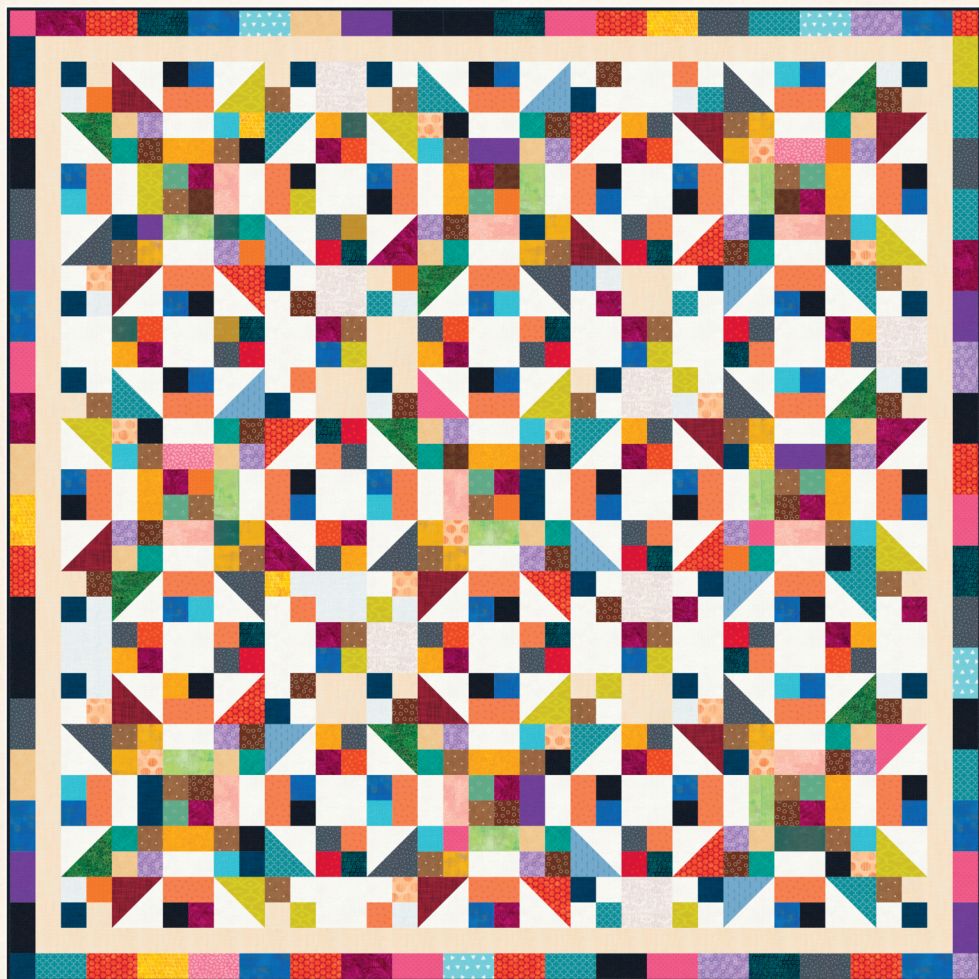


# Scrap Shuffle



Stitch  
*from your* Stash  
2026

**General Information and TIPS:**

- Measurements are based on 42" of usable fabric width and include ¼ " seam allowances unless otherwise indicated.
- Sew with right sides together unless otherwise stated.
- Starch your fabric and let it dry completely before ironing and cutting. This will facilitate piecing and will ensure that your triangles do not stretch as much.
- Pressing directions are indicated and important for ease of block assembly.

**Fabric Requirements**

**2 ¾ yds** of **light** background

**4 ¼ yds** assorted medium to dark **prints**

**¾ yds** Binding or 9 - 2.5" x 42" strips

**5 yds** Backing

If using strips for blocks A, B, C, D and sashing units you will need the following number of strips.

Strip Width	Light background	Medium to Dark Prints
2.5" x 40"	12	48

**TIP:** To help prevent bowing, use shorter strips when sewing strip sets.

A maximum strip length of 22" works well.

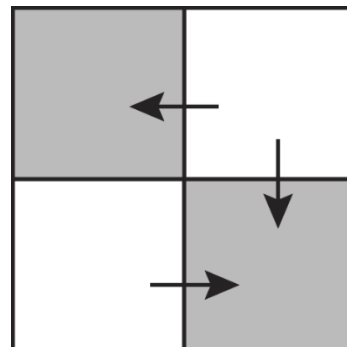
This also increases the number of strip set combinations and results in more color variation.

Print - Border 2	4	72	-	-
Background- Blocks	72	36	-	36
Background - Sashing	-	-	36	-
<b>Border 1</b>	(8) 2.5" x 42"			
<b>Binding</b>	(9) 2.5" x 42"			

**Note:** In the block diagrams, **grey-shaded pieces represent print fabrics.**  
Background fabrics are shown in white.

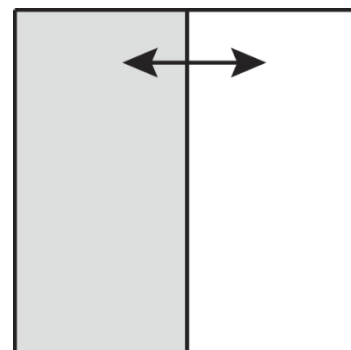
<b>Block A</b>	<b>1 Block</b>	<b>9 Blocks</b>
Make	4	36

1. Using two (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " background squares and two (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " print squares, sew together to make a four-patch unit as shown.
2. Press seams as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



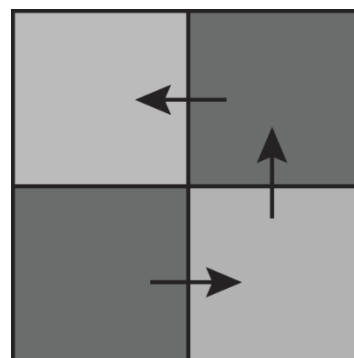
<b>Block B</b>	<b>1 Block</b>	<b>9 Blocks</b>
Make	4	36

1. Using one (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " print rectangle and one (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " background rectangle, sew together to make Block B as shown.
2. Press seams as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



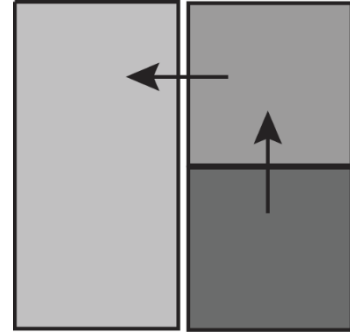
<b>Block C</b>	<b>1 Block</b>	<b>9 Blocks</b>	<b>Sashing</b>
Make	5	45	28

1. Using four (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " print squares, sew together to make a four-patch unit as shown.
2. Press seams as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



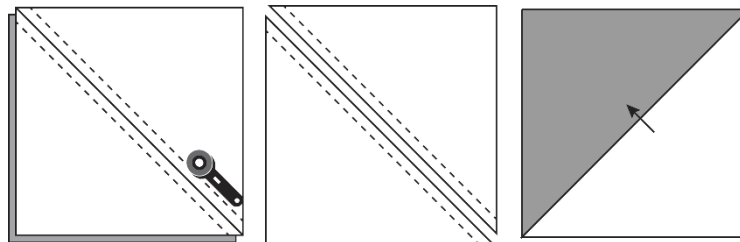
Block D	1 Block	9 Blocks
Make	4	36

- Using two (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " print squares and one (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " print rectangle, sew together to make Block D as shown.
- Press seams as indicated.
- Unfinished size:  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



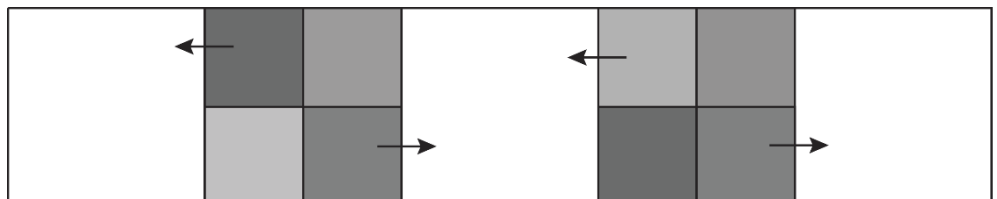
Block E	1 Block	9 Blocks
Make	8 Half Square Triangles	(36) 5" x 5" To yield 72 Half Square Triangles

- On the wrong side of a 5" x 5" background square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner.
- Layer the marked background square right sides together with a 5" x 5" print square.
- Sew a seam  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the drawn line.
- Press to set the seams.
- Cut on the drawn line to create two (2) half-square triangle units.
- Press seams toward the darker fabric and **trim** each unit to  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Sashing Unit	1 Block	12 Blocks
Make	(3) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Background (2) Block C	(36) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Background (24) Block C

- Using three (3)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " background squares and two (2) Block C units, sew together to make the sashing strip as shown.
- Press seams as indicated.
- Unfinished size:  
 $20\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".

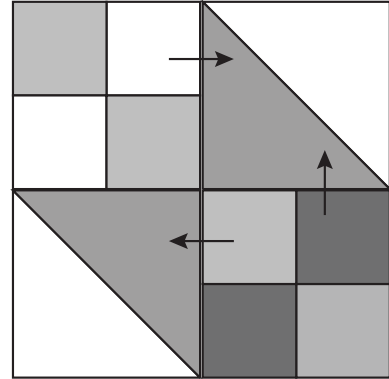




### Block F

Make 36

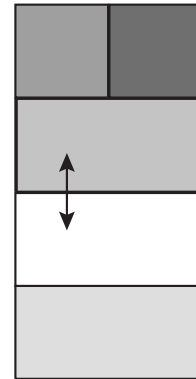
1. Sew together one Block A, one Block C and two (2) half square triangles as shown.
2. Press seams as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $8\frac{1}{2}" \times 8\frac{1}{2}"$ .



### Block G

Make 36

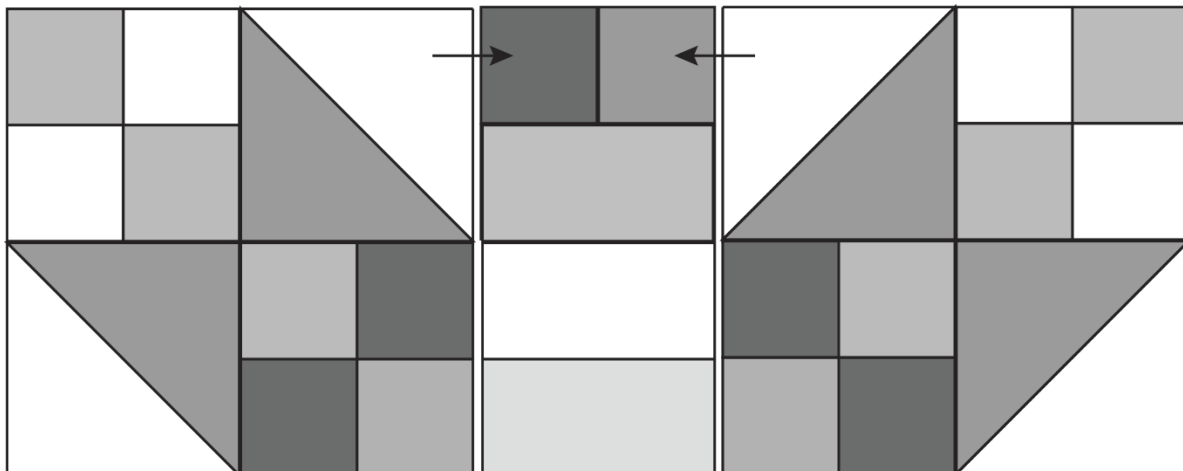
1. Sew together one Block B, one Block D as shown.
2. Press seams as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $8\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ .



### Top and Bottom Block

Make 18

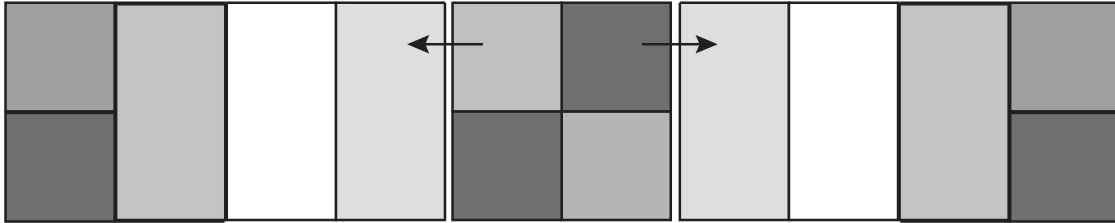
1. Sew two (2) Block F units to the sides of one (1) Block G unit to create the top and bottom block section as shown.
2. Press seams as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $8\frac{1}{2}" \times 20\frac{1}{2}"$ .



## Center Block

Make 9

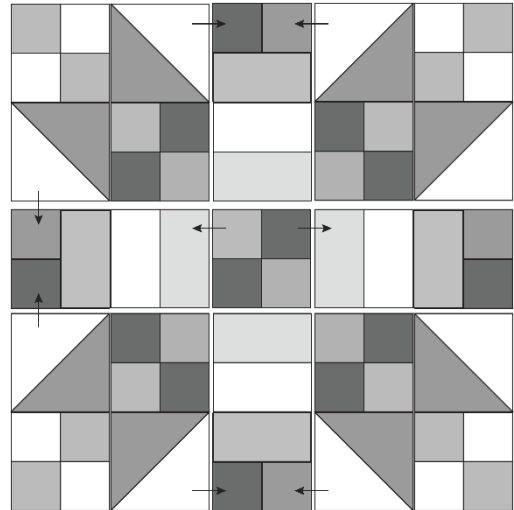
1. Sew two (2) Block G units to the sides of one (1) Block C to create the center block section as shown.
2. Press seams as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $4\frac{1}{2}" \times 20\frac{1}{2}"$ .



## Full Block

Make 9

1. Sew together block in rows as show.
2. Press as indicated.
3. Unfinished size:  $20\frac{1}{2}" \times 20\frac{1}{2}"$ .

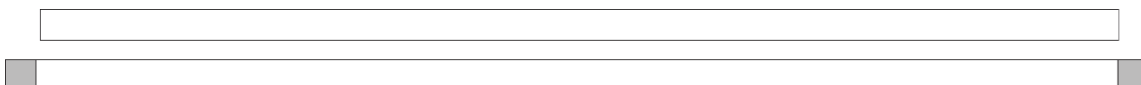


## Border 1

(8)  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 42"$  Background  
(4)  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$  Print squares

1. Sew together two (2)  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 42"$  border strips end to end. Make 4.
2. From the assembled border strips, cut four (4)  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 68\frac{1}{2}"$  side border strips. Measure before cutting. See tip.
3. Sew one (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 2\frac{1}{2}"$  square to each end of the top and bottom strips. (Make 2)

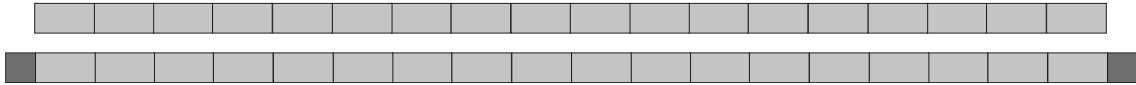
**TIP:** For straight borders, measure the quilt center at the **top, middle, and bottom**. Add the three measurements together, divide by three, and cut the border strips to that length. **Pin borders evenly and sew without stretching** to help prevent wavy edges.



## Border 2

(18) 2 ½" x 4 ½" print

1. Sew together eighteen (18) 2 ½" x 4 ½" print units end to end to create one border strip. Make 4.
2. Sew one (1) 2 ½" x 2 ½" square to each end of the top and bottom strips. Make 2.

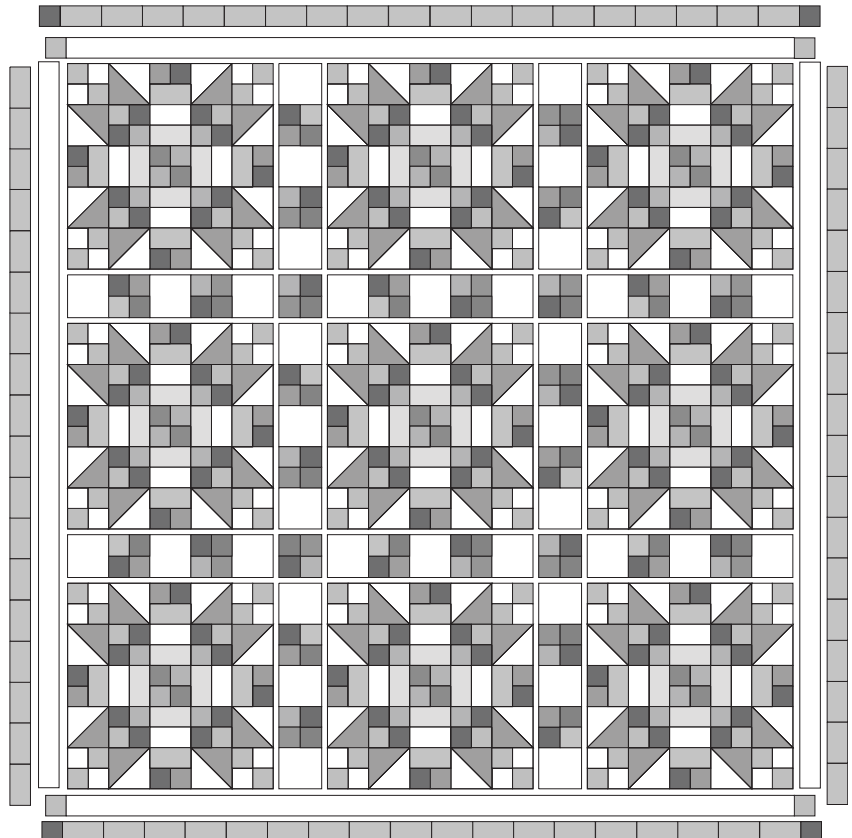


## Assembly

1. Assemble the blocks and sashing units into horizontal rows as shown.
2. Press seams open.
3. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt center.
4. Quilt center size: 68" x 68"
5. Sew Border 1 to the left and right sides of the quilt center, then to the top and bottom. Press seams outward.
6. Sew Border 2 to the left and right sides of the quilt, then to the top and bottom. Press seams outward.
7. Finished quilt top size: 76" x 76".

## Finishing

1. Layer quilt top, batting and backing.
2. Quilt and bind as desired.

Binding	¾ yds
Backing	5 yds
